program Overview

- Students acquire skills and knowledge to work on repair, service and maintenance of pleasure use vessels from 15' to 150' in length.
- MST workers engage in all aspects of work on vessels including but not limited to: hull repair; painting of wood, metal and composite materials; ship right and joinery work; mast and rigging repairs and retro fits; and on board electrical and plumbing systems.

- The student satisfies graduation requirements and successfully graduates.
- 2. The student successfully completes "Level One" technical training.
- 3. The student becomes indentured as an official apprentice to a community based employer in a trade of their choice.

PROGRAM DETAILS

- The MST program is a district program "hosted" at Parkland Secondary during the afternoon blocks (3 & 4) in second semester.
- Students participate in 3 ½ hour seminars 1 night per week at Quadrant Marine Institute for advance technical training as "Level One" Marine Service Technicians (MST).
- Technical training at Quadrant runs from the beginning of September to the end of May, with a 3 week unpaid practicum placement during spring break in March.
- Students should consider taking drafting, joinery & metal work in grades 9, 10 & 11 in preparation for this program.
- Students will ideally have work experience placements in the marine service industry (weekends & school vacations).
- Students should aim to have essential grad courses complete prior to commencement of this program.
- Capable students may choose to work part time mornings in the local marine service industry while participating in the MST program.
